THE MINISTRIES OF SACRED HEART PARISH

SACRED LITURGY (*LITURGIA*): "The twenty-four elders fall down before the one who sits on the throne and worship him, who lives forever and ever. They throw down their crowns before the throne, exclaiming: 'Worthy are you, Lord our God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things; because of your will they came to be and were created.'" (Rev 4, 10-11) "Do this in memory of me." (Luke 22, 19)

Liturgy is described as the summit toward which all activity of the Church is directed and the source from which we derive our faithfulness as Disciples of Christ.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion:

Religious instruction for children grades one through eight is held on Wednesday evenings from 6:45 to 7:45 at Sacred Heart School. This helps to prepare children for reception of the basic Sacraments of Holy Eucharist, Penance and Confirmation.

Parents and godparents of children to be baptized are required to take a Baptism preparation class. The class presents the theology of Baptism, the roles and responsibilities of parents and godparents, the explanation of symbols used and the Rite of Baptism itself.
