## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The origins of today's solemnity lie in thirteenth-century Belgium. In those days, people seldom received Holy Communion, and never from the chalice. A nun in a troubled convent, Juliana of Liège, devoted her life to stirring up love for the Eucharist, lobbying for a feast day to honor the Blessed Sacrament with Masses and processions.

Juliana may have been inspired by the Ascension Day processions in nearby Bruges. Crusaders brought a treasure home to Bruges from Constantinople in 1204: a reliquary said to contain a cloth from Joseph of Arimathea with which he had helped prepare the body of Jesus for burial. The stain on the cloth was said to be the holy blood itself, and so the people of Bruges built a great basilica to house the relic. Bruges became a great center of pilgrimage because of this treasure, and the procession of the Holy Blood is still one of the greatest festivals in Belgium today. The bishop carries the relic through the narrow streets, and the people wear medieval costumes and act out scenes from the Bible.

### Children's Faith Formation

Registration for Children's Faith Formation, CFF, is currently in progress. Parents need to register their students each year. CFF is religion class for all students in grades 1 through 8 who do not attend Sacred Heart School. All students should receive 8 years of religious education. CFF is not the First Communion or Confirmation program, although students must attend CFF or Sacred Heart School to register for sacrament classes. Please find the blue CFF registration forms in the rack in the back of the church. The registration fee is \$25.00 for basic C.F.F. classes.

### Confirmation Registration Year 1 and Year

2 Confirmation registration for ALL parish students, whether they attend Sacred Heart School or CFF, begins now for students who will be entering the 8th grade in August of 2018. Students MUST attend a Year 1 CFF class or Sacred Heart School the year before Year 2 (two consecutive years). There is no special Confirmation registration form for students who are entering the 7th grade in August 2018, only a CFF registration form is required if not a Sacred Heart School student. There is a \$30.00 registration fee due in the second year.

### First Communion registration Year 1 and

Year 2 Registration for First Communion begins now for students in their second consecutive year of classes entering 2nd grade or older. First grade students NOT attending Sacred Heart Parish School must attend CFF classes to receive 1st Communion in their 2nd grade year. All students, regardless of grade, must attend two consecutive classes for Sacraments. There is a \$30.00 registration fee due in the second year. Registration forms for Year 2 students are currently available in the parish office for all eligible students, either CFF or Sacred Heart School students. Registration for the 2018-2019 school year ends June 30, 2018.

### Sacred Heart Preschool

Sacred Heart School will be taking over the operation of Big Apple Preschool -- to be renamed Sacred Heart Preschool. Setting up a pre-school involves needing many supplies and materials. If you have any of the following items, it would be greatly appreciated if you could donate them to our new pre-school and leaving them in the Sacred Heart School Office.

### Supplies Needed:

- Storage units-shelving, cabinets, bookcases, etc.
- Cots & Tubs
- Puzzles, blocks, pasta noodles
- Art supplies (beads, paints, glitter, gift wrap, cookie cutters, etc)
- Manipulative toys, sand and water toys, tricycles, outdoor play equipment
- Science equipment (rocks, shells, beads, magnifying glasses, marbles)
- Music/video equipment (drums, triangles, maracas, educational CD's)
- Dress up clothes and costumes, dolls, jewelry
- Play kitchen
- Area carpets, little kids chairs and tables
- Stationary, pencils, crayons, stamps, notebooks, paper bags, Ziploc bags etc.
